

SEND hub Medium Term Planning - Autumn Term

We deliver our curriculum through an engaging, topic-based approach that interconnects classroom activities, using the central theme as a foundation to enrich the overall learning experience. For Autumn 1, our topic is 'All About Me', and for Autumn 2, our topic is 'Let's Celebrate'. Below, you'll find our topic map, outlining what your child will be learning throughout the term, all connected to the themes. Children will be at different starting points and we will use the Orchard Curriculum to guide the learning for each individual child.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Find ways to calm themselves through being calmed and comforted by their key person
- Express preferences and try new things
- Engage with others through talk, gesture and gaze
- Use engagement to achieve a goal
- Find ways to manage transitions e.g., now and next board
- Play with increasing confidence on their own with their key worker nearby
- Jigsaw topics 'Being Me in My World' and 'Celebrating Difference'
- Develop relationships with peers
- Use activities with greater independence



Communication and Language

- Turn towards familiar sounds e.g., key worker, tambourine to signal stop
- Gaze at faces and copy facial expressions
- Make eye contact for longer periods
- Copy what adults do
- Enjoys singing, music and toys that make sounds
- Recognise that they are calmed by a familiar and friendly voice
- Listen and respond to a simple instruction
- Use gestures like waving and pointing for communication
- Use pictures/objects to request what they would like
- Understand single words in context e.g., cup, milk, teddy
- Understand frequently used words such as 'all gone', 'no' and 'bye-bye'
- Focus on an activity of their choice

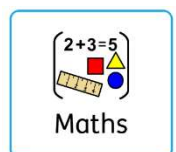
Physical Development

- Squiggle While you Wiggle sessions
- Fine motor activities - threading, using tweezers
- Develop manipulation and control of writing pencils
- Explore different tools
- Use a range of marks such as random movements and lines
- Show a desire to be independent such as wanting to feed themselves and dress and undress
- Put on own coat with support
- Clap and stamp to music
- Kick and throw balls
- Move in a range of ways- running, jumping, rolling, crawling
- Sensory circuit sessions



Maths

- Combine objects like stacking blocks and cups.
- Putting objects inside others and taking them out
- Join in with the day, date and weather
- Take part in finger rhymes with numbers
- React to changes of an amount in a group - up to 3
- Use counting like behaviour such as making sounds, pointing or saying number names in sequence
- Comparing numbers
- Match and sort objects
- Exploring pattern and shape
- Subitising
- Adding and subtracting



Literacy

- Foundation to phonics - discriminating different sounds, recognising sounds in the environment
- Engaging in a range of stories relating to the topic
- Enjoy songs and rhymes, tuning in and paying attention
- Join in with a range of songs and nursery rhymes, making some sounds/ gestures
- Share books with an adult
- Pay attention and respond to pictures in a book
- Have favourite books
- Recognise their name with a photo
- Enjoy drawing freely

Expressive Arts and Design

- Show attention to sounds and music
- Responds emotionally and physically to music when it changes
- Explore a range of musical instruments and play them
- Explore paint using fingers and other body parts
- Explore making marks using different resources
- Drawing faces
- Develop pretend play for example holding a block to ear and pretending it's a phone
- Explore using a range of construction materials - Duplo, wooden blocks, junk modelling
- Explore different materials and use senses to investigate them
- House role play area
